Examples of inscriptions found on Plaques to remember people of significance

A Welsh community living in New York at the time decided they would donate their own stone to the site, marking Wales' role in American history. Their plaque reads:

"Fy Iaith, Fy Ngwlad, Fy Nghenedl, Cymry am byth" which in English translates to "Our language, our country, our birthplace, Wales forever."

Another example is in memory of Alderman Thomas Jones. Died October 18, 1903. Mayor of this Borough 1892-3. Erected by friends and fellow townsmen.

Alderman Thomas Jones was a ship owner, coal exporter and Mayor of Newport in 1892-3.
